MESSAGE FROM WISSAR PRESIDENT HAGLUND

Compatriots I thank all of you for electing me as your state society president and National Trustee. It is an honor to serve you. With the great job my predecessors did, filling their shoes is going to be a challenge. I rise to the challenge.

I have been attending NSSAR Leadership and Congresses to pick up all the information I can to relay back to all of you. The latest is the raising of National dues by \$15 at the Congress in Orlando, FL. The debate on this went on for nearly an hour. The primary concern was that we would lose membership by raising the dues. It was explained to everyone present that NSSAR operates on the NSSAR portion of the dues collected. They are operating over \$200,000 in the red and have not raised dues in 10 years and if the dues were not raised, we would go broke and not be able to operate or carry out the goals or mission of our Society. The proposal to raise dues was passed by a large majority of the trustees.

The Wisconsin Society was faced with a similar situation. After cutting our budget to the bare bones we were still short approximately \$2000 to make our budget. The last time the Wisconsin Society raised dues was back in 1975/6. To make the



budget the Wisconsin Society Board of Managers voted unanimously to raise dues \$8 from \$22 to \$30 for the State Society and \$4 from \$6 to \$10 for chapters.

This makes a total of \$40 for state and chapter. Combined with National that makes for a total of \$90 for dues. NSSAR is also putting together an unbelievable museum project. It will be accessible online to everyone. If you go to the schools to talk about the Revolution you will be able to direct the teachers to our education tab on the sar.org website to see our educational programs and, when finished, go to the interactive museum site.

The State of Wisconsin has formed the America250 Wisconsin Commission. Two of the mandated members of the commission are the SAR and DAR. We are the primary committee members for the Historical Societies. I am the SAR representative to the commission. Please give some thought as to how you all think the State of Wisconsin should celebrate the 250th anniversary of our Country. I will pass on your ideas.

The Great Lakes District (GLD) of SAR is made up of Wisconsin, Michigan and Illinois. The Vice President General (VPG) for the GLD rotates to each state. The 2023-2024 VPG Dave VanHoof is from Michigan. For the 2024-2025 it comes to Wisconsin then Illinois. At the recent GLD meeting I was nominated and elected to be the GLD VPG for '24-'25. I am honored.

Let us all enjoy each other's fellowship, have fun and promote the upcoming 250th anniversary of our great country. We, the DAR and CAR are the primary representatives of the Patriots that made this country possible. We should be leading the way in promoting what they brought about.

250th FUNDRAISING

Who ever thought the WISSAR M-K Chapter would need fundraising for its projects? Not until we took we took on projects to recognize Rev War monuments within our chapter did we know. In2022 we took on several projects in the run-up to the 250th anniversary of the USA. The adage "there ain't no free lunch," applied even to our patriotic projects!

When we conducted seminars for Baron Von Steuben in 2022 and Thaddeus Kosciusko & Bernardo Galvez in October 2023 we learned about room rents, food and beverages and permit fees. These can be substantial. Our meager treasury fell pitifully short of needs. Luckily, the Annis Avery and Milwaukee DAR chapters threw us a much appreciated lifeline.

The Katyn Rally Society-Memory and Identity also donated to our cause. This group organizes motorcycle rallies as well events that support truth, memory and historical identity of Polish contributions in the USA. They visit towns with Polish names like our own Pulaski in northeastern Wisconsin. The rally's motto captures the spirit of the important contributions of Tadeusz Kosciuszko and Kazimierz (Casimir) Pulaski. Both have monuments in Milwaukee. In the words of Jan Lechoń's poem, The Hymn of Poles Abroad:

...'I'm like a soldier, ready for anything
Both in the homeland and in a foreign country
I watch and guard the treasure of Polish language,
Polish spirit, Polish custom...'

In the future, M-K will rely increasingly on funding from outside sources like the Katyn Rally Society. It'll be a tough hill to climb. We're estimating future 250th costs as follows:

2024 – Pulaski statue re-dedication and Liberty Tree = \$2,500; Rev War life size bronze statue = \$2,200 Total = **\$4,700**.

2025 - Washington statue re-dedication = \$3,100; Rev War life size bronze statue = \$86,200 Total = **\$117,000**


2026 - Rev War life size bronze statue = \$ 45,000

NATHAN BURPEE EVENT



Revolutionary War patriot Nathan Burpee was honored with a marker at his resting place in Grand Blanc MI. Past president Sam Keith placed the WISSAR wreath and President Robert Haglund and Past President and VPG William Austin gave a sword salute at the gravesite.

Burpee was one of the earliest defenders of our nation. He passed away at his farm in Atlas in 1836.

His descendants and the community came together to honor him with a bronze plaque at the Perry-McFarlen Cemetery; Burpee's family says their fore-father fought because he believed in this great country.

Membership to the Sons of the American Revolution is reserved for direct family members of the heroes who fought in our nation's war for freedom.

Their goal is to continue to honor the memory of these patriots and educate the next generation on the sacrifice that was made to achieve freedom for the United States (excerpt from WJRT).

LIBERTY TREE DEDICATION

The Liberty Tree was a significant symbol of American resistance and independence during the American Revolution. It served as a rallying point for colonists who opposed British tyranny. Many here today represent patriot ancestors who served in the American Revolution and were committed to securing our rights and liberties. The tree we're planting today represents a broader story of the American Revolution and the birth of the United States.

The Liberty Tree's roots can be traced back to the mid-1760s when colonists began using trees as symbols of resistance against British oppression. The most famous of these trees was the "Liberty Tree" in Boston, which was a towering elm tree located in what is now Washington Street.

The Sons of Liberty, a secret organization advocating for colonial independence and the predecessor of the SAR, frequently met under the Liberty Tree's branches. Prominent members included Samuel Adams and John Hancock.

By that time, liberty trees were so well known that they had become landmarks in and of themselves. But later in 1775, the beloved Boston elm tree, which was nearly 130 years old, paid the price for its fame when a group of loyalists and British soldiers hacked it down.

The original trees WISSAR got were from the Liberty Tree Society in Walpole, NH and were clones of one of two remaining real Liberty Trees. It was nicknamed the "Herby Tree"; it had to be cut down due to disease at 200 years old but was able to be cloned. The other original Liberty Tree that was cloned was a Tulip Tree that a hurricane wiped out. Clones of that tree are controlled by an organization in MD. Those clones are shipped and are about 1ft tall. The tree planted here came from a nursery in Baraboo and are a Valley Forge American Elm, but not a clone.



On behalf of the Wisconsin Society of the Sons of the American Revolution (WISSAR), WIDAR and WICAR dedicates this Liberty Tree to all of Veterans, serving as a reminder of the enduring commitment to liberty and freedom that shaped the United States. Today's event is one part of many events that will be sponsored by WISSAR leading up to the 250th year celebration of our independence. Thank you for being part of it.
